Gulf Consortium Chairman Meets with Governor Scott

Yesterday, Escambia County Commissioner and Gulf Consortium Chairman Grover Robinson met with Governor Rick Scott. The Florida Association of Counties' Executive Committee spent time with the Governor discussing the state's recovering economy and FAC's 2014 policy priorities. As chair of the Consortium, Commissioner Robinson emphasized the importance of working together across local, state and federal programs to ensure the greatest benefits for the Gulf of Mexico. He thanked the Governor for the work of Department of Environmental Secretary Herschel Vinyard and Mimi Drew, Florida's appointee to the federal Council and for their coordination with the Gulf Consortium. Commissioner Robinson also pressed the Governor for appointments to the Consortium as the board begins to undertake the important work of developing the State Expenditure Plan.

Procurement Policy Comment Deadline is February 7

At the January 24th meeting, the Board of Directors work-shopped a draft procurement policy and set a February 7th deadline for comments. In September, the Board of Directors decided to use the procurement infrastructure of Leon County. In accordance with that direction, the draft State Expenditure Plan procurement policy relies heavily upon the Leon County procurement policy for its structure and content. The Board will consider both the procurement policy and the State Expenditure Plan procurement solicitation document at the March 26th meeting. Consortium Receives Update from Council

Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration Council (Council) Executive Director, Mr. Justin Ehrenwerth, attended the January 24, 2014 Gulf Consortium meeting in Tallahassee and provided an update on the Council. Mr. Ehrenwerth spoke at length about the start-up activities the Council is undertaking. Notably, the Council is in the same position as the Consortium, that is, funds have not been released to the Council pending final approval of the US Treasury Regulations.

Additionally, Mr. Ehrenwerth outlined the steps needed for the Consortium to receive funding that will be used to develop the Consortium's State Expenditure Plan. Mr. Ehrenwerth stated that after US Treasury Regulations are finalized, the Council must complete policy decisions on formula methodologies for Spill Impact Allocation (Pot #3), promulgate its own rules, and establish a grant infrastructure. When asked about the potential timeline for these activities, Mr. Ehrenwerth projected this calendar year.

Mr. Ehrenwerth was well received and was able to participate in the visioning session immediately after lunch.
